### **SUMMARY**

An estimated 385,500 acres of wheat was planted for 2018, ~27,500 acres less than 2017. Low plantings continue to be attributed to weaker wheat prices and increased competition from other crops and feed prices.

Mark Lundy, Assistant Cooperative Extension **Specialist:** The early season was marked by below average rainfall and infrequent precipitation events. which resulted in some early drought stress and weak stands, particularly in dryland areas. After a warmer than average early-season, from mid-February to early-March there were several multiday periods with daily low temperatures below freezing for multiple hours. As a result, some frost damage was observed in the Northern San Joaquin Valley and the Sacramento Valley. To date, there have been few diseases of note. The above average precipitation in March and April has helped to return the annual rainfall total to within a few inches of normal in much of the state, and the crop appears to be making up for a weak start to the season.

### **RED AND WHITE WHEAT**

Hard Red wheat, the top wheat class grown in California, accounted for 76 percent of all acreage grown in California this year. SY-Summit 515 (~20 percent) was the top planted red wheat variety, followed by Cal Rojo (15 percent). Yecora Rojo remained the most commonly planted red variety in the Southern part of California. Patwin 515 (34 percent) was the top Hard White wheat planted and SY-Ovation (29 percent) was the top Soft White variety. Approximately 65 percent of all red and white varieties are grown in the San Joaquin Valley.

## DURUM

Durum acreage in California remained similar to 2017. UC Desert King HP and UC Desert King combined accounts for 40 percent of the total 2018 durum wheat planted acreage in California. UC Desert King HP (35 percent) was the top planted variety in the San Joaquin Valley, and UC Desert King (25 percent) in Southern California.

## **Survey Description**

This report reflects wheat that was planted in the Fall of 2017/early Winter 2018 for harvest in Spring/ Summer of 2018; as well as intended Spring plantings in far Northern California. This survey estimates the state's *planted* acreage.
